Fifty years ago, there were 230 women's colleges in the United States. Now, after decades of shutdowns and mergers, only 40 remain.

With Sweet Briar's permanent closing announcement, the question remains – are women's colleges still relevant today? Outside of the expensive price compared to other public co-ed colleges and universities, many women college like Wellesley and Agnes Scott College are here to stay. And not surprisingly, those schools and our very own, Stephens are reaching out to the ladies of Sweet Briar reassuring them that they are more than welcomed to finish school at their locations.

Sounds pretty easy, right? But here's the catch, if enroll any time after those dates, you will be fined a late fee by MU which is equivalent to a semester's 1-credit hour cost, based on your in-state tuition rate.

CUE IN QUOTE STILL: Assistant Registrar Kathy Corley advises that students "plan ahead, and have options or overrides in hand when you got to register," as MU students do have priority for registration and empty spots in classrooms are filled on a first-come, first-serve basis.

So, if you're serious about enrolling be sure to speak to your advisor on Advising Day (which is coming up on April 7th) about your plans to attend a class at MU, complete your required paperwork and always have a black-up plan.
